
Grace, mercy, and peace from God the Father and Christ Jesus our Lord.

But I am not ashamed, for I know the one in whom I

have put my trust, and I am sure that he is able to guard until that day what I have entrusted to him. ¹³Hold to the standard of sound teaching that you have heard from me, in the faith and love that are in Christ Jesus. ¹⁴Guard the good treasure entrusted to you, with the help of the Holy Spirit living in us.






